# Meeting of Board of Trustees Medfield Memorial Public Library January 13, 2022

This meeting took place remotely.

## **Staff Reports:**

Adults – Leigh Montville's author talk in December was a success and other outside programs have also done well. In-house programs have also been well attended despite Omicron. Knitting Clinic and the book clubs will be held virtually or hybrid this month. Art N Bloom will be in person March 4-6!

Children's – the virtual program "How to Draw Pokemon" was very popular. Virtual Music Makers has had increasing attendance. In house programs have been small and the Take & Makes flew off the cart. A new 15-hour person has been hired in the children's room.

Teens – There were 16 volunteers for a total of 40 hours in December. Seven teens/tweens attended the Teen Advisory Board. There were seven programs with a total of 27 participants.

### **Director Report:**

The budget is on track. The first try of replacing the light bulbs in the Dailey Room was unsuccessful. An electric lift is needed. There is discussion of updating the Wi-Fi transmitter access points in the library for better service. The Trustees support the staff if they feel the need to move in person programs to virtual until the Covid siege has abated.
